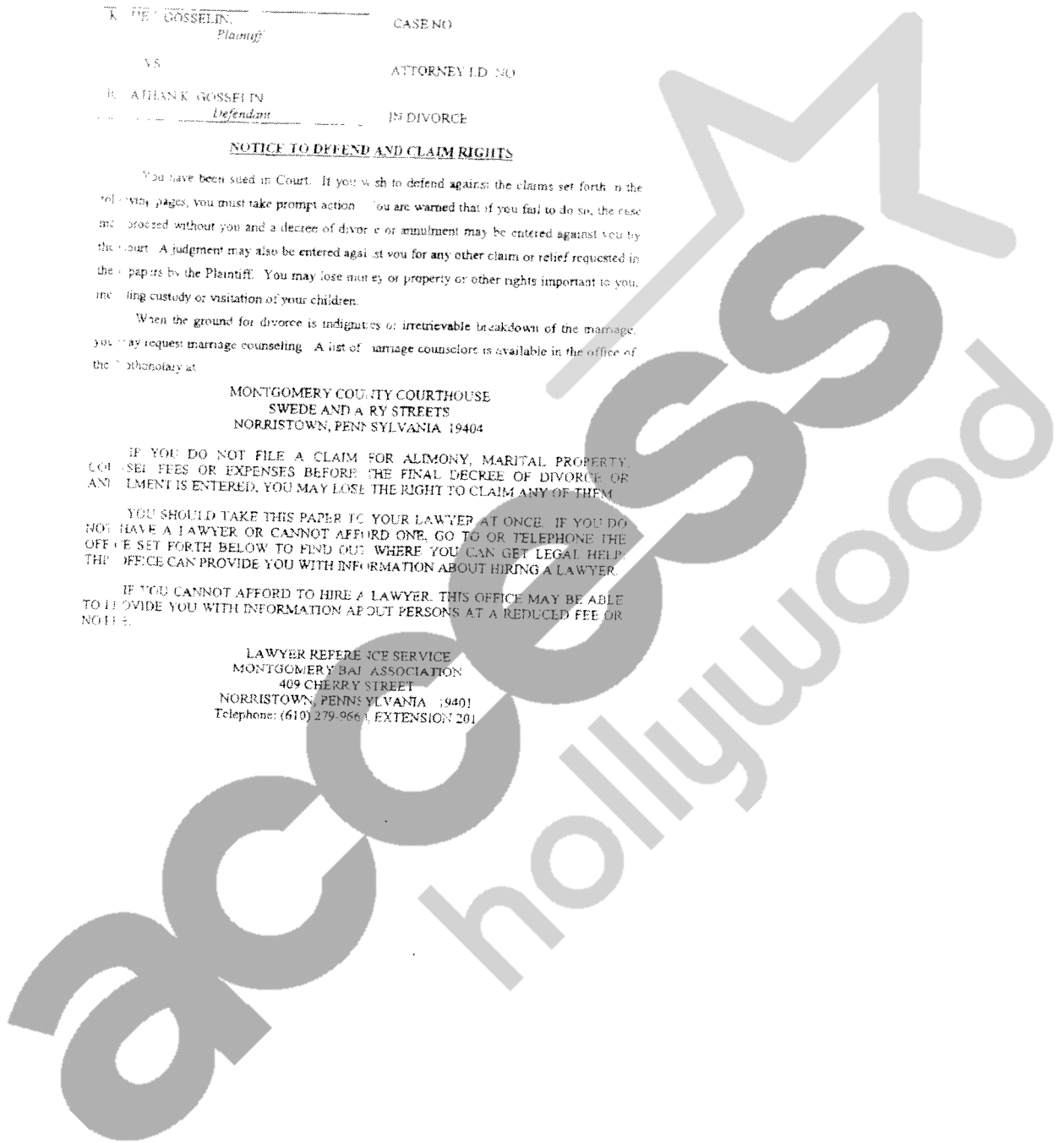

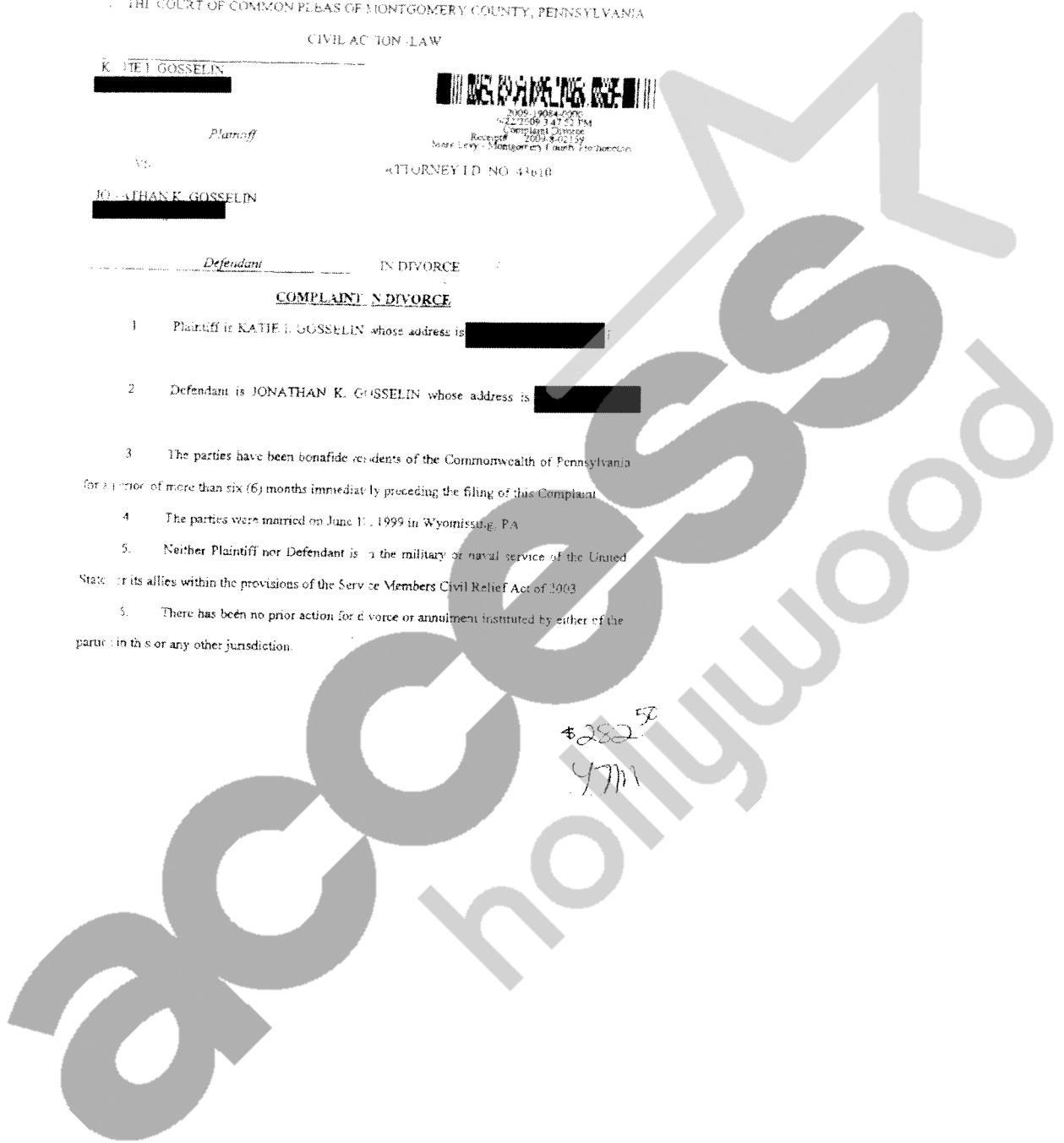
COMPLAINT IN DIVORCE

1. Plaintiff is KATIE L. GOSSELIN whose address is [REDACTED]

3. The parties have been bonafide residents of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for a period of more than six (6) months immediately preceding the filing of this Complaint.

8 Plaintiff has been advised of the availability of counseling and of the right to request that the Court require the parties to participate in counseling.

COUNT I - GROUNDS FOR DIVORCE

Request for a No-Fault Divorce Under 3301(c) of the Divorce Code

9 The prior paragraphs of this Complaint are incorporated herein by reference as though set forth in full.

10 The marriage of the parties is irretrievably broken.

WHEREFORE, if both parties file affidavits consenting to a divorce after ninety (90) days have elapsed from the commencement of this action, Plaintiff respectfully requests the Court to enter a decree of divorce pursuant to Section 3301(c) of the Divorce Code.

Request for a no-fault divorce under Section 3301(d) of the Divorce Code

11 The prior paragraphs of this Complaint are incorporated herein by reference as though set forth in full.

12 The marriage of the parties is irretrievably broken.

13 At the time of the hearing, Plaintiff will submit an affidavit alleging that the parties have lived separate and apart for at least two (2) years.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests the Court to enter a decree of divorce pursuant to Section 3301(d) of the Divorce Code.

COUNT II - EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION

Request for equitable distribution of marital property under Section 3502 of the Divorce Code

14 The prior paragraphs of this Complaint are incorporated herein by reference as though set forth in full.

15 Plaintiff and Defendant have acquired marital property as defined by the Divorce Code, which is subject to equitable distribution pursuant to Section 3502 of the Divorce Code

16 Plaintiff and Defendant have been unable to agree as to the equitable distribution of this property, as of the date of the filing of this Complaint.

17 Plaintiff requests that the Court equitably divide, distribute or assign the marital property between the parties.

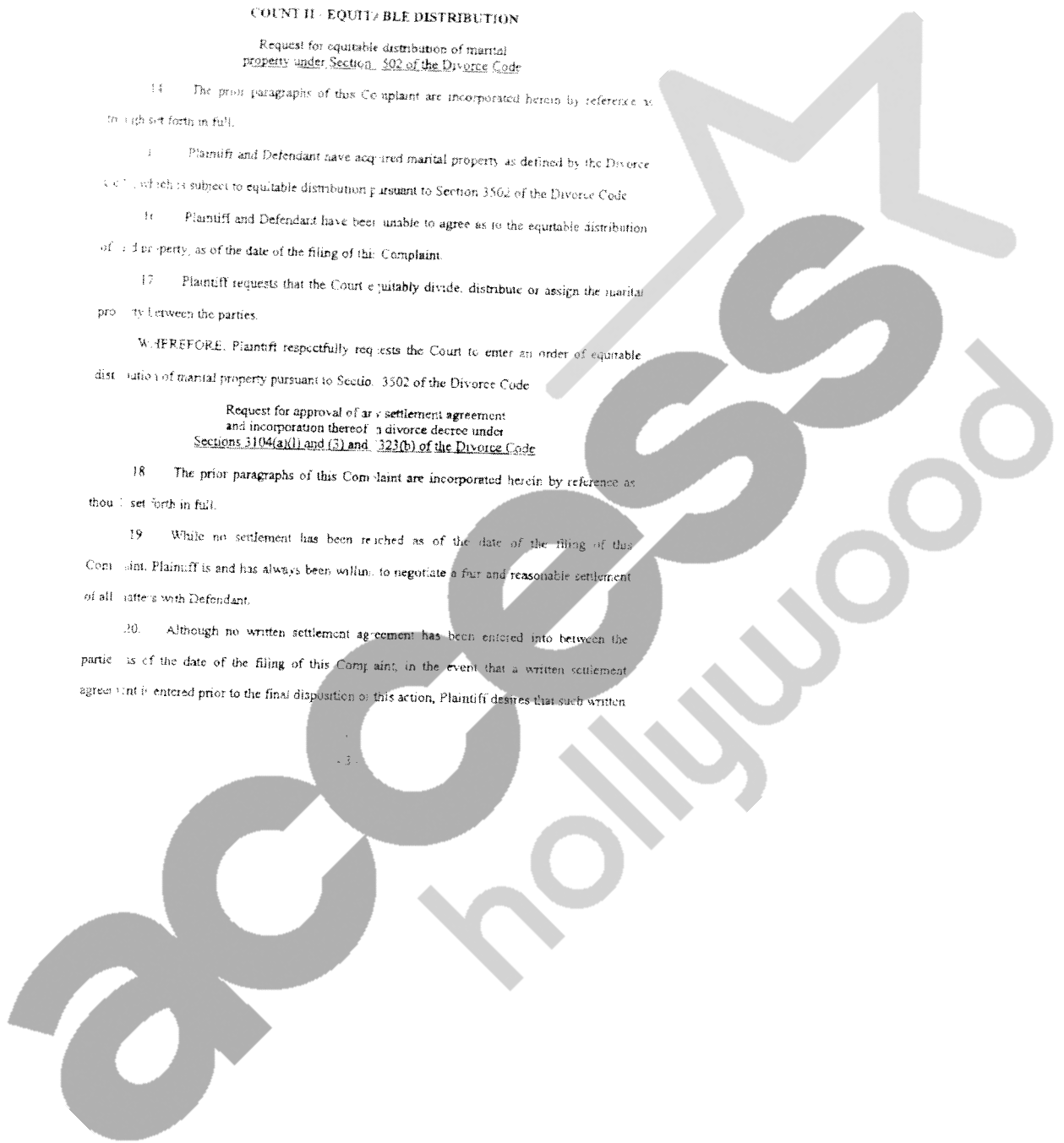
WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests the Court to enter an order of equitable distribution of marital property pursuant to Section 3502 of the Divorce Code

Request for approval of any settlement agreement and incorporation thereof in divorce decree under Sections 3104(a)(1) and (3) and 323(b) of the Divorce Code

18 The prior paragraphs of this Complaint are incorporated herein by reference as though set forth in full.

19 While no settlement has been reached as of the date of the filing of this Complaint, Plaintiff is and has always been willing to negotiate a fair and reasonable settlement of all matters with Defendant.

20 Although no written settlement agreement has been entered into between the parties as of the date of the filing of this Complaint, in the event that a written settlement agreement is entered prior to the final disposition of this action, Plaintiff desires that such written



... settlement agreement be approved by the Court and incorporated in any divorce decree which
... be entered dissolving the marriage between the parties.

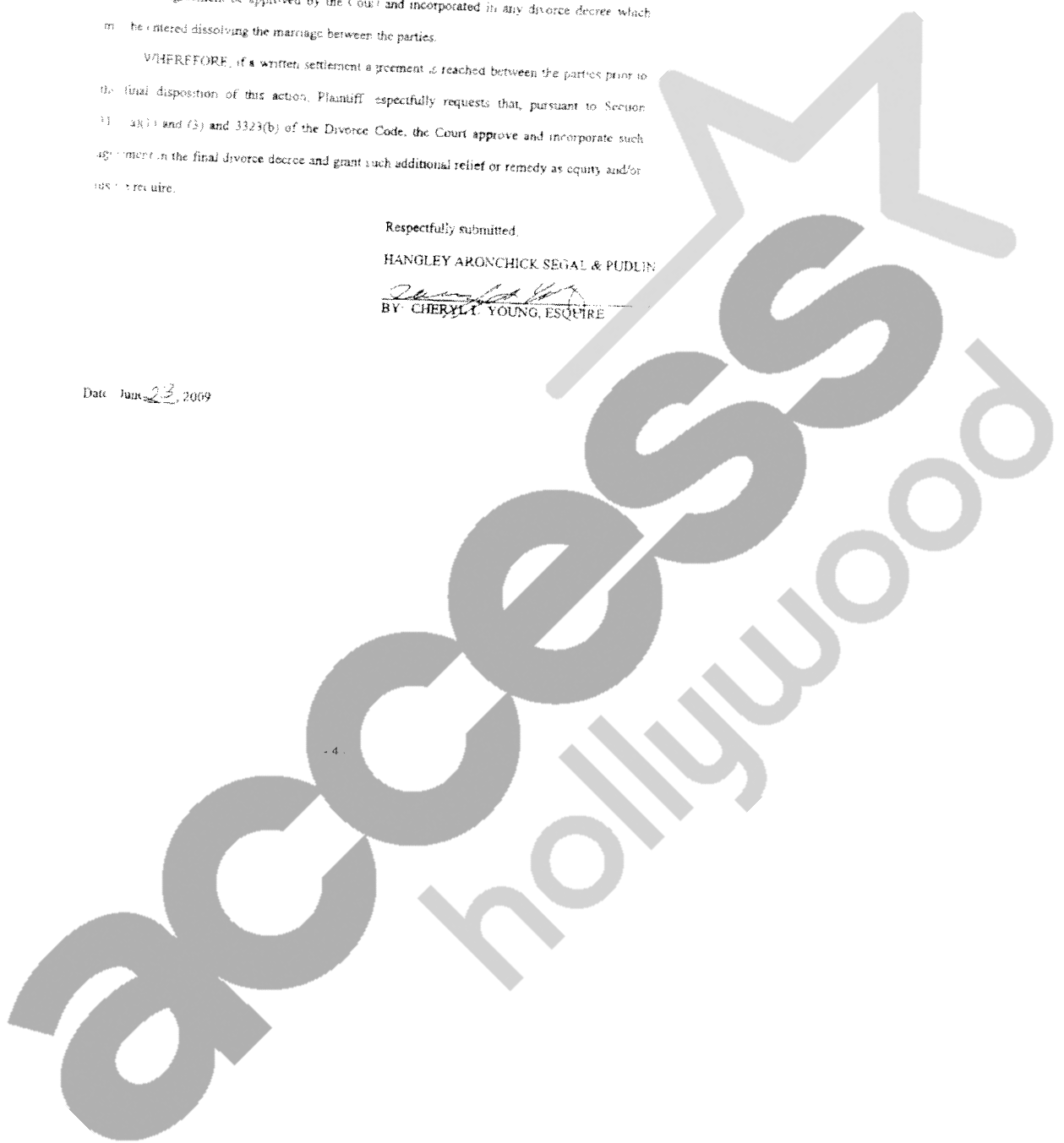
WHEREFORE, if a written settlement agreement is reached between the parties prior to

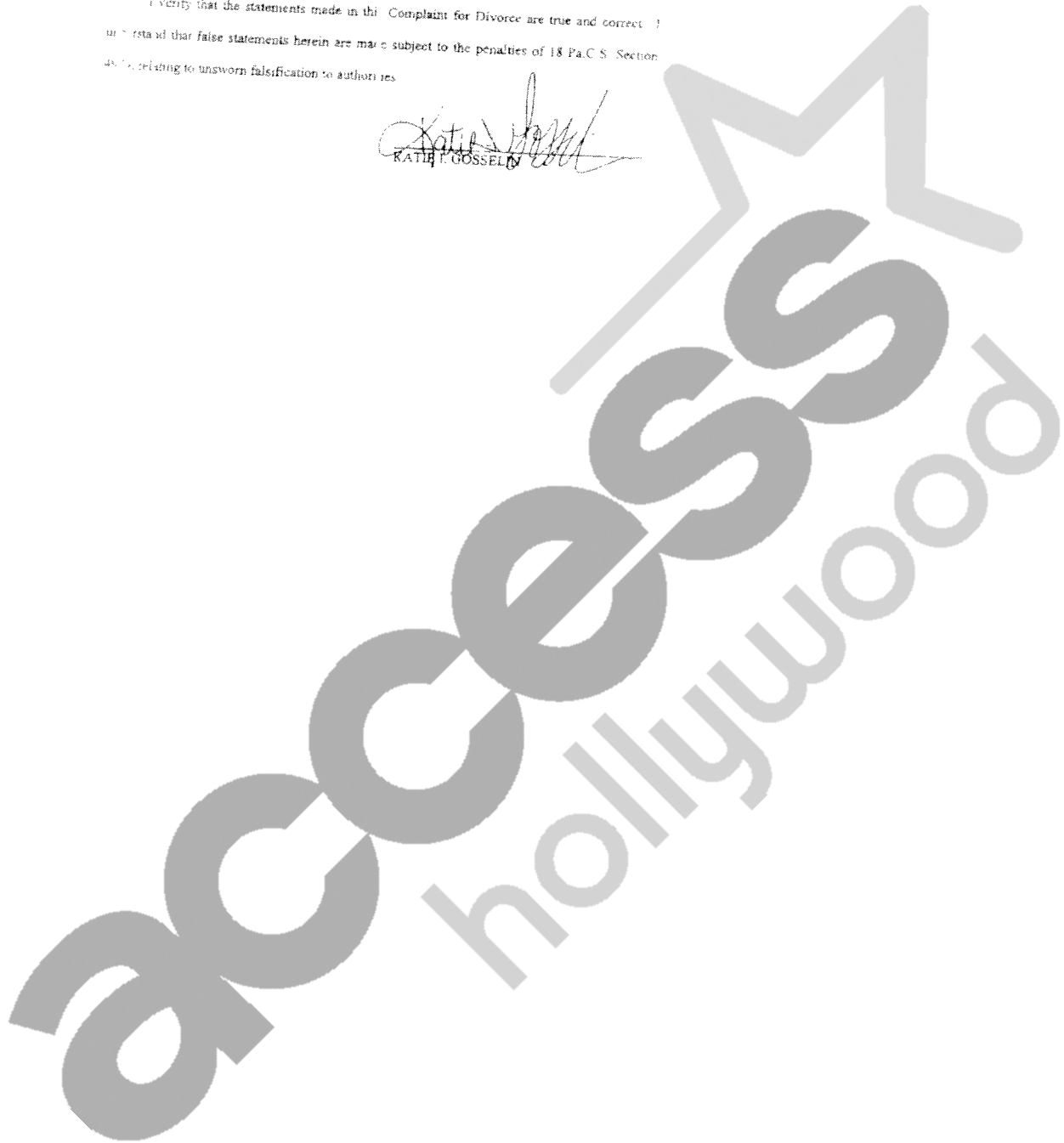
