1 Plaintiff Pauly Shore ("Plaintiff") complains and alleges as follows:
2

3 ALLEGATIONS COMMON TO ALL CAUSES OF ACTION

4 1. Plaintiff is, and at all times relevant hereto was, a resident of the State of
5 California, County of Los Angeles.

6 2. Defendant Peter Shore ("Defendant"), Plaintiff's brother, is, and at all times
7 relevant hereto was, a resident of the State of Washington. Defendant is an officer and member of
8 the Board of Directors of the Company, as defined below, which has its principal place of business
9 in the State of California, County of Los Angeles and where Defendant regularly conducts business.

10 3. Plaintiff does not know the true names and capacities, whether individual,
11 corporate, partnership or otherwise, of defendants Does 1 through 20, inclusive, and therefore sues
12 these defendants by such fictitious names. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and on that basis
13 alleges, that each of the fictitiously named defendants is, in some manner, responsible for the events
14 and happenings referred to herein. When Plaintiff ascertains the true names and capacities of Does
15 1 through 20, he will amend this Complaint accordingly. (Some or all of the named Defendant and
16 Does 1 through 20 are sometimes individually referred to herein as a "Defendant" and collectively
17 as the "Defendants".)

18 4. Plaintiff, Defendant and their elderly mother Mrs. Mitzi Shore have been sole
19 Directors of The Comedy Store (the "Company"), a corporation duly organized and existing under
20 the laws of the State of California, in which Mrs. Shore is also the sole shareholder.

21 5. Defendant is also the chief executive officer of the Company and is in control
22 of the ongoing operations of the Company.

23 6. Over the course of the past few years, Plaintiff became concerned as to
24 Defendant's care and treatment of Mrs. Shore, who suffers from Parkinson's disease and other
25 neurological maladies. Mrs. Shore's condition has rendered her susceptible to unscrupulous
26 behavior and undue influence.

27 7. A letter from Mrs. Shore's estate lawyers to Defendant dated July 16, 2009,
28 which, *inter alia*, raised concerns of elder abuse gave further credence to the likelihood of

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1 Defendant's abuses regarding Mrs. Shore's ongoing physical and financial well-being.

2 8. In an attempt to gain clarity on and rectify any potential abuses, Plaintiff, in
3 his capacity as a Director, on or about November 18, 2009 requested that Defendant produce certain
4 business documents related to Defendant's management of the Company.

5 9. Instead of producing the documents as required by law, on information and
6 belief, Defendant retained Holland & Knight as counsel to contest the disclosure of the requested
7 information.

8 10. On information and belief, Defendant also used his relationship with Mrs.
9 Shore, the sole shareholder, to have Plaintiff improperly removed from the Company's Board of
10 Directors.

11
12 FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY
13 WITH DIRECTOR'S RIGHT OF INSPECTION (CAL. CORP. CODE SEC. 1602)

14 (By Plaintiff against Defendant)

15 11. Plaintiff repeats and re-alleges the allegations contained in paragraphs 1
16 through 10, inclusive, and incorporates the same herein as though set forth in full.

17 12. Plaintiff was re-elected as a Director of the Company by resolution dated
18 December 2008.

19 13. On or about November 18, 2009, Plaintiff, through his business manager and
20 during regular business hours, contacted Defendant requesting three years of Company tax returns,
21 monthly cash flow reports and the monthly check register covering the last 36 months, the year to
22 date general ledger for 2009 and the general ledger for 2008.

23 14. Defendant has failed and refused to provide any of the requested
24 documentation.

25 15. Plaintiff has no plain, speedy and adequate remedy in the ordinary course of
26 law, other than the relief sought in this Complaint, in that Plaintiff has no means by which to
27 otherwise discover how Defendant has operated the Company and the commensurate effect on Mrs.
28 Shore's financial stake as sole shareholder.

1
2 SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION FOR UNDUE INFLUENCE IN REMOVAL
3 OF PLAINTIFF AS A DIRECTOR OF THE COMPANY (CIV. CODE SEC. 1575)

4 (By Plaintiff against Defendants)

5 16. Plaintiff repeats and re-alleges the allegations contained in paragraphs 1
6 through 15, inclusive, and incorporates the same herein as though set forth in full.

7 17. Defendant is the son of Mrs. Shore.

8 18. On information and belief, Defendants took unfair advantage of his filial
9 relationship with Mrs. Shore and her mental capacity to coerce Mrs. Shore into removing Plaintiff
10 from the Company's Board of Directors.

11
12 PRAYER FOR RELIEF

13 WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays for judgment against Defendant as follows:

- 14 1. Release of the requested Company documents and enjoining Defendant from
15 continuing to fail and refuse to comply with his statutory obligations to release the requested
16 Company documents;
- 17 2. Nullification of any instrument removing Plaintiff from the Company's Board
18 of Directors;
- 19 3. For reasonable attorneys' fees recoverable according to law;
- 20 4. For all other proper orders;
- 21 5. For costs of suit incurred herein; and
- 22 6. For such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper.
